Instructions

We are pleased that you have decided to apply to SUNY Orange!

Applications are processed on a rolling basis as they become complete. Applicants are encouraged to apply early so that they can be ready to register in the next available semester.

The following items are needed to complete your application:

1. A completed application form or apply online at www.sunyorange.edu
2. \$30 application fee for new applicants; \$20 application fee for readmits
3. Official high school transcript or GED Score Report

Students currently attending high school should submit their current high school transcript. (Applicants with international credentials should refer to the Special Instruction Notes below.) Financial Aid cannot be awarded until we have proof of high school graduation (a final high school transcript or GED Score Report) as per federal regulations. Social security number is required for financial aid processing.

4. Official college transcripts from every college attended. Transcripts are reviewed for transfer credit and for granting Assessment Waivers.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTION NOTES

Admissions Status (Question 2):

Choose one of the following:

New Student—an applicant who has never attended SUNY Orange or any other college as a degree-seeking student.

Transfer Student—an applicant who has attended another college as a degree-seeking student but has never attended SUNY Orange.

Readmitted Student—an applicant who has attended SUNY Orange as a degree-seeking student before but has been away from the college for two or more semesters (excluding Summer).

Second Degree Student—an applicant who has already earned a SUNY Orange degree.

Campus Location (Question 4): Select the campus at which you plan to attend the majority of classes. Note that not all courses/programs are available at the Newburgh Extension Center at this time.

Academic Program Choice (Question 5): For degree and certificate listings and program guidelines, please refer to page 13 in the Viewbook or use the listing below. Choose only one program.

International and Non-Citizen Applicants (Question 16): Permanent residents, and others who have immigrant status, with high school diplomas from foreign countries must file original records of their high school credentials, including mark sheets. If the original records are not in English, an English translation done by the applicant's national consulate or an official translating agency must be provided. The Admissions Office reserves the right to require a credential evaluation in cases where high school graduation cannot be easily determined.

Applicants with university credits earned outside of the U.S. must have their credentials evaluated by an authorized credentials agency. World Education Services (www.wes.org) is recommended. A course-by-course report is required for transfer credit evaluation purposes.

International applicants applying for a student visa (F-1) or those who are currently attending a U.S. college and wish to transfer to SUNY Orange on a student visa must complete a supplemental International Student form.

Please Note: U.S. immigration law states that individuals who arrived in the United States on a Tourist (B-1, B-2) Visa on, or after, April 12, 2002, are not permitted to enroll in a full course of study.

As of January 30, 2003, it is mandated by law that this institution collect and report information for the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS).

Felony/Dismissal (Question 17): A felony in NY State law is defined as a crime for which more than one year in prison may be imposed. The felony question applies if you have been convicted as an adult. If you have been adjudicated as having juvenile delinquent or youthful offender status, you are required to respond to the felony question by indicating a response of no.

Suspension is defined as a sanction imposed for disciplinary reasons that results from a student leaving school for a fixed time period, less than permanently.

Dismissal from a college for disciplinary reasons is defined as permanent separation from an institution of higher education on the basis of conduct or behavior.

An affirmative response to either question will not automatically prevent admission, but you will be asked to provide additional information. This information will be reviewed by a committee to ensure campus safety. Any falsification or omission of data may result in a denial of admission or dismissal.
